The Gospel Lesson: Luke 5:12-16 pew Bible, page 939

Jesus cleanses a leper in today's Gospel lesson. The leper knew that Jesus could heal him. Do you think he could keep his healing a secret?

¹² Once when Jesus was in one of the cities, a man covered with a skin disease was there. When he saw Jesus, he bowed with his face to the ground and begged him, "Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean." ¹³ Then Jesus stretched out his hand, touched him, and said, "I am willing. Be made clean." Immediately the skin disease left him. ¹⁴ And he ordered him to tell no one. "But go, show yourself to the priest, and, as Moses commanded, make an offering for your cleansing, as a testimony to them." ¹⁵ But now more than ever the word about Jesus spread abroad; many crowds were gathering to hear him and to be cured of their diseases. ¹⁶ Meanwhile, he would slip away to deserted places and pray.

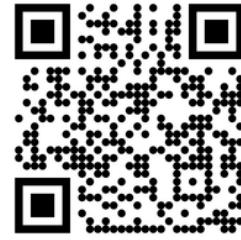
