

NICENE CREED







Disaster Response Ministry

Giving is the best way you can help!

Spring tornadoes started early this year with large tornadoes in January in Georgia and in Alabama and again with widespread destruction recently in Mississippi and northern Alabama.

In addition to those, smaller tornadoes have touched down in many communities across our synod, leaving damaged homes and families in need. Your synod disaster ministry team is actively responding alongside congregations within the impacted areas to address the needs of survivors and help communities organize for recovery.
