FIRST READING: Zechariah 9:9-12 Pew Bible pg. #869

The coming messianic king will inaugurate an era of disarmament and prosperity.

Because of God's covenant with Israel, the people are designated as "prisoners of hope."

⁹Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. ¹⁰He will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war-horse from Jerusalem; and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall command peace to the nations; his dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth. ¹¹As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your prisoners free from the waterless pit. ¹²Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double.

For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. ¹⁶Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. ¹⁷But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. ¹⁸For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. ¹⁹For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. ²⁰Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. ²¹So I find it to be a law that when I want to do what is good, evil lies close at hand. ²²For I delight in the law of God in my inmost self, ²³but I see in my members another law at war with the law of my mind, making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. ²⁴Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? ²⁵Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!

Luke 18:18-30 Pew Bible pg. #958

In this account of the "rich young ruler," Jesus answers the question, "Then who can be saved?"

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the 18th chapter.

Congregation: Glory to you, O Lord.

¹⁸A certain ruler asked him, 'Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' ¹⁹Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone.

²⁰You know the commandments: "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; Honor your father and mother." ²¹He replied, 'I have kept all these since my youth.' ²²When Jesus heard this, he said to him, 'There is still one thing lacking. Sell all that you own and distribute the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' ²³But when he heard this, he became sad; for he was very rich. ²⁴Jesus looked at him and said,

'How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God! ²⁵Indeed, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.' ²⁶Those who heard it said, 'Then who can be saved?' ²⁷He replied, 'What is impossible for mortals is possible for God.'

²⁸Then Peter said, 'Look, we have left our homes and followed you.' ²⁹And he said to them, 'Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or wife or brothers or parents or children, for the sake of the kingdom of God, ³⁰who will not get back very much more in this age, and in the age to come eternal life.



on earth as it is in heaven.




