



FIRST READING: Isaiah 51:1-6 Pew Bible pg. #667

Just as God had called Abraham and Sarah and given them many descendants, so now God offers comfort to Zion. God's deliverance will come soon and will never end.

¹Listen to me, you that pursue righteousness, you that seek the Lord. In response to God's merciful activity, we are to worship by living holistic, God-pleasing lives. Our values and viewpoints are not molded by the time in which we live but are transformed by the Spirit's renewing work. God's grace empowers different forms of service among Christians, but all forms of ministry function to build up the body of Christ.

¹I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. ²Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. ³For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. ⁴For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, ⁵so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. ⁶We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ¹ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; ²the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

At a climactic point in Jesus' ministry, God reveals to Peter that Jesus is "the Messiah, the Son of the living God," and Jesus responds with the promise of a church that will overcome the very gates of Hades.

### **SERMON**

"But Who Do You Say that I Am?"

Fr. R.J. Powell, Chaplain Tyson House University of Tennessee Episcopal-Lutheran Campus Ministry

Fr. RJ Powell serves as the University Chaplain for Tyson House, the Lutheran and Episcopal campus ministry at UT Knoxville. A native of central Virginia, near Richmond, he was raised in the Christian Church/Church of Christ tradition. After completing undergrad at James Madison University, he attended Emmanuel Christian Seminary in Johnson City where he also became involved in the Episcopal Church. While in discernment for the priesthood, he met his now husband, Michaelangelo. Once he finished an Anglican Studies program at Sewanee in 2015, he and Michaelangelo were married and moved to Knoxville where he was ordained and served as the Associate Rector at St. James. During his ministry there, he also helped Pastor John Tirro at Tyson House for a number of years before he stepped down. Fr. RJ was appointed Chaplain by Bishops Cole and Strickland in June of 2022.
