

FIRST READING: Genesis 50:15-21 Pew Bible pg. #47

After Jacob's death the brothers of Joseph begged for forgiveness for the crime they had done against him. You intended to do me harm, Joseph said, but God used this as an opportunity to do good and save many lives.

¹⁵Realizing that their father was dead, Joseph's brothers said, "What if Joseph still bears a grudge against us and pays us back in full for all the wrong that we did to him?" ¹⁶So they approached Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this instruction before he died, ¹⁷'Say to Joseph: I beg you, forgive the crime of your brothers and the wrong they did in harming you.' Now therefore please forgive the crime of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him. ¹⁸Then his brothers also wept, fell down before him, and said, "We are here as your slaves." ¹⁹But Joseph said to them, "Do not be afraid! Am I in the place of God? ²⁰Even though you intended to do harm to me, God intended it for good, in order to preserve a numerous people, as he is doing today. ²¹So have no fear; I myself will provide for you and your little ones." In this way he reassured them, speaking kindly to them.

Lector: ¹Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name. Congregation: ²Bless the Lord, O my soul, and do not forget all his benefits—

- L: ³who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases,
- C: 4who redeems your life from the Pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy,
- L: ⁵who satisfies you with good as long as you live so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.
- C: ⁶The Lord works vindication and justice for all who are oppressed.
- L: ⁷He made known his ways to Moses, his acts to the people of Israel.
- C: 8The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

- L: ⁹He will not always accuse, nor will he keep his anger for ever.
- C: ¹⁰He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 12:1-12 Pew Bible pg. #1099

The author of Hebrews encourages a disconsolate congregation to endure their hardships for there is a promise in the midst of suffering.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, ²looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

³Consider him who endured such hostility against himself from sinners, so that you may not grow weary or lose heart. ⁴In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. ⁵And you have forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as children—

'My child, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, or lose heart when you are punished by him

for the Lord disciplines those whom he loves, and chastises every child whom he accepts.'

Endure trials for the sake of discipline. God is treating you as children; for what child is there whom a parent does not discipline? ⁸If you do not have that discipline in which all children share, then you are illegitimate and not his children. ⁹Moreover, we had human parents to discipline us, and we respected them. Should we not be even more willing to be subject to the Father of spirits and live? ¹⁰For they disciplined us for a short time as seemed best to them, but he disciplines us for our good, in order that we may share his holiness. ¹¹Now, discipline always seems painful rather than pleasant at the time, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

¹²Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, ¹³and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint, but rather be healed.






