BONHAEFFER'S NEW YEAR POEM

Dietrich Bonhoeffer had been in prison for two years with little prospect for release. He had been discovered as part of the conspiracy to assassinate Hitler. He slipped this poem into a letter he was allowed to write to his mother on her seventieth birthday, December 28, 1945.

By gracious pow'rs so wonderfully sheltered, and confidently waiting come what may, We know that God is with us night and morning

and never fails to greet us each new day.

Yet is this heart by its old for tormented, still evil days bring burdens hard to bear; Oh, give our frightened souls the sure salvation,

for which, O Lord, you taught us to prepare.

And when this cup you give is filled to brimming with bitter suff'ring, hard to understand,

We take it thankfully and without trembling out of so good and so beloved a hand. Yet when again in this same world you give us the joy we had, the brightness of your sun,

We shall remember all the days we lived through and our whole life shall then be yours alone.

By gracious pow'rs so faithfully protected, so quietly, so wonderfully near, We live each day in hope, with you beside us, and go with you through ev'ry coming year.
