PSALM OF REJECTION Psalm 22:1-21 Pew Bible pg. #490 Rev. Wyn Bryant, Lector Lector: My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?

Congregation: ²O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest.

- L: ³Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel.
 - ⁴In you our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.
- C: ⁵To you they cried, and were saved; in you they trusted, and were not put to shame.
- L: ⁶But I am a worm, and not human; scorned by others, and despised by the people. ⁷All who see me mock at me; they make mouths at me, they shake their heads;
- C: 8"Commit your cause to the Lord; let him deliver—let him rescue the one in whom he delights!"

- L: ⁹Yet it was you who took me from the womb; you kept me safe on my mother's breast. ¹⁰On you I was cast from my birth, and since my mother bore me you have been my God.
- C: ¹¹Do not be far from me, for trouble is near and there is no one to help.
- L: ¹²Many bulls encircle me, strong bulls of Bashan surround me; ¹³they open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion.
- C: ¹⁴I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast; ¹⁵my mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death.
- L: ¹⁶For dogs are all around me; a company of evildoers encircles me. My hands and feet have shriveled; ¹⁷I can count all my bones.
- They stare and gloat over me; ¹⁸they divide my clothes among themselves, and for my clothing they cast lots. ¹⁹But you, O Lord, do not be far away!
- O my help, come quickly to my aid! ²⁰Deliver my soul from the sword, L: my life from the power of the dog! ²¹Save me from the mouth of the lion!

THE PASSION OF CHRIST remain seated

John 18:12-John 19:42 Pew Bible pg. #988 ¹²So the soldiers, their officer, and the Jewish police arrested Jesus and bound him. ¹³First they took him to Annas, who was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, the high priest that year. 14 Caiaphas was the one who had advised the Jews that it was better to have one person die for the people.

¹⁵Simon Peter and another disciple followed Jesus. Since that disciple was known to the high priest, he went with Jesus into the courtyard of the high priest, ¹⁶but Peter was standing outside at the gate. So the other disciple, who was known to the high priest, went out, spoke to the woman who guarded the gate, and brought Peter in. The woman said to Peter, "You are not also one of this man's disciples, are you?" He said. "I am not." 18 Now the slaves and the police had made a charcoal fire because it was cold, and they were standing around it and warming themselves. Peter also was standing with them and warming himself.

¹⁹Then the high priest questioned Jesus about his disciples and about his teaching. ²⁰Jesus answered, "I have spoken openly to the world; I have always taught in synagogues and in the temple, where all the Jews come together. I have said nothing in secret. ²¹Why do you ask me? Ask those who heard what I said to them; they know what I said." ²²When he had said this, one of the police standing nearby struck Jesus on the face, saying, "Is that how you answer the high priest?" ²³Jesus answered, "If I have spoken wrongly, testify to the wrong. But if I have spoken rightly, why do you strike me?" ²⁴Then Annas sent him bound to Caiaphas the high priest.

²⁵Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself. They asked him, "You are not also one of his disciples, are you?" He denied it and said, "I am not." ²⁶One of the slaves of the high priest, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, asked, "Did I not see you in the garden with him?" ²⁷Again Peter denied it, and at that moment the cock crowed.

²⁸Then they took Jesus from Caiaphas to Pilate's headquarters. It was early in the morning. They themselves did not enter the headquarters, so as to avoid ritual defilement and to be able to eat the Passover. ²⁹So Pilate went out to them and said, "What accusation do you bring against this man?" ³⁰They answered, "If this man were not a criminal, we would not have handed him over to you." ³¹Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and judge him according to your law." The Jews replied, "We are not permitted to put anyone to death." 32(This was to fulfill what Jesus had said when he indicated the kind of death he was to die.)

So they took Jesus; ¹⁷and carrying the cross by himself, he went out to what is called The Place of the Skull, which in Hebrew is called Golgotha. ¹⁸There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, with Jesus between them. ¹⁹Pilate also had an inscription written and put on the cross. It read, "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews." ²⁰Many of the Jews read this inscription, because the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, in Latin, and in Greek.

²¹Then the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, "Do not write, 'The King of the Jews,' but, 'This man said, I am King of the Jews.'" ²²Pilate answered, "What I have written I have written." ²³When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his clothes and divided them into four parts, one for each soldier. They also took his tunic; now the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece from the top. ²⁴So they said to one another, "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it to see who will get it." This was to fulfill what the scripture says,

"They divided my clothes among themselves, and for my clothing they cast lots." ²⁵And that is what the soldiers did.

Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. ²⁶When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, "Woman, here is your son." ²⁷Then he said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.

²⁸After this, when Jesus knew that all was now finished, he said (in order to fulfill the scripture), "I am thirsty." ²⁹A jar full of sour wine was standing there. So they put a sponge full of the wine on a branch of hyssop and held it to his mouth. ³⁰When Jesus had received the wine, he said, "It is finished." Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

³¹Since it was the day of Preparation, the Jews did not want the bodies left on the cross during the sabbath, especially because that sabbath was a day of great solemnity. So they asked Pilate to have the legs of the crucified men broken and the bodies removed. ³²Then the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first and of the other who had been crucified with him. ³³But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. ³⁴Instead, one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once blood and water came out. ³⁵(He who saw this has testified so that you also may believe. His testimony is true, and he knows that he tells the truth.) ³⁶These things occurred so that the scripture might be fulfilled, "None of his bones shall be broken." ³⁷And again another passage of scripture says, "They will look on the one whom they have pierced."

³⁸After these things, Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus, though a secret one because of his fear of the Jews, asked Pilate to let him take away the body of Jesus. Pilate gave him permission; so he came and removed his body. ³⁹Nicodemus, who had at first come to Jesus by night, also came, bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, weighing about a hundred pounds. ⁴⁰They took the body of Jesus and wrapped it with the spices in linen cloths, according to the burial custom of the Jews. ⁴¹Now there was a garden in the place where he was crucified, and in the garden there was a new tomb in which no one had ever been laid. ⁴²And so, because it was the Jewish day of Preparation, and the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE CROSS OF CHRIST / STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The cross rings the congregation. The pastor speaks on God's behalf. Stand and face the cross.

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Pastor: My people, what wrong have I done to you? What good have I not done for you? Listen to me: I am your Creator, Lord of the Universe. I have entrusted this world to you, but you have created the means to destroy it.

Congregation: Holy God, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

II.

- P: I made you in my image, but you have degraded body and spirit. You have marred the image of your God. You have turned your backs to me.
- C: Holy God, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

III.

- P: I filled the earth with all that you need, so that you might serve and care for one another as I have cared for you. But you have cared only to serve your wealth and power.
- C: Holy God, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

IV.

- P: I made children of one blood to live in families rejoicing in one another. But you have enmity against the races and have divided the nations.
- C: Holy God, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

V.

- P: I commanded you to love your neighbor as yourself, to forgive even your enemies. But you have made vengeance your rule and hate your guide.
- C: Holy God, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

VI.

- P: In the fullness of time, I sent my Son, that in him you might know me. That through him, you would find life and peace. But you put him to death on a cross.
- C: Holy God, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

VII.

- P: Through the living Christ, I called you into my Church to be servants to the world. But you have grasped at privilege and forgotten my will.
- C: Holy God, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

VIII

- P: I have given you a heavenly gift, a share in the Holy Spirit. I have given you the spiritual energies of the age to come. But you not only turned away and crucified my Son, you have ignored my Spirit.
- C: Holy God, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

IX.

- P: I have consecrated you in the truth. I have made you to be one in the unity of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. But you have abandoned my Church and shrouded my truth.
- C: Holy God, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

X.

- P: Turn again, my people and listen to me. I offer new life. Rise up out of your life in Christ Jesus. He humbled himself and in obedience accepted death on the cross. I have bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus, every knee should bow and every tongue confess Jesus Christ is Lord.
- C: Holy God, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

Congregation: You are worthy, O Christ, for you were slain and by your blood you have saved us. From every race and language, from every people and nation, you have made us a kingdom of priests, able to stand and serve before our God. We adore you, O Jesus, and we praise you.
