#### Here are some 2024 highlights:

- +On December 7, the Cookie Walk was the largest ever with over 10,000 cookies donated by the members of Faith Lutheran Church. Besides raising funds for mission work, the event welcomes the community into our facilities in what has become a cherished Christmas tradition for many families. - +Our Lenten emphasis was finding hope in suffering. The congregation read <u>Man's Search for Meaning</u> by Victor Frankl. We met for midweek classes around a meal.
- +We paused to meet on the first Wednesday of each month for classes, prayer, fellowship, worship and supper. Attend the next 3C Night for an experience of **c**are, **c**ommunity and **c**ompassion.

- +English Language Classes (ELL) were offered at Faith Lutheran Church. This outreach ministry was generated and organized by Mildred Fenske. Instructors are Melissa Horning, Bob Moore and David Wyatt.
- +Shepherd of the Lake Lutheran Church in Tellico Village observed their 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary as a chartered congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on September 22. Faith Lutheran Church was honored as the founder of the congregation.
- +We held a unified worship service for Thanksgiving on Sunday morning, November 24, with one of our famous potluck dinners following. What a blessing to have all our musicians in one worship service!

Ted Primka: If funding is needed that can certainly be approved. Per our constitution we have 5% flexibility in our budget.

A motion was made by Christina Landau and seconded by Dan Primka to accept the 2025 budget as presented. Ted Primka asked for a show of hands in favor and the motion passed. There was none opposed.

Mildred Fenske thanked the Property Team and Council for their dedication.

Faith Lutheran Church is the host church for the Shepherd of Hope Food Pantry. Our team churches are: Concord United Methodist, Grassy Valley Baptist, First Baptist of Concord, and Farragut Presbyterian.

**Community Partners:** This year we have expanded our community support to include the following community partners: Second Harvest Food Bank, Helping Mamas, Fleet Feet, Water into Wine, Costco, Publix; Kroger, Aldi, Federal Express, Randy Davis Milk Fund, and Farragut Pharmacy.

Parking lot evangelism happens! We talk, we pray, we take prayer requests, we listen, we invite people to join our services. We provide nutritious recipes for the food we distribute. We distribute fresh vegetables during the summer and fall courtesy of the Concord United Methodist Church's Garden.

The pantry was supported by three grants this year: two from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and one from Siddiqui Foundation. The pantry was also supported by many individual donations and donations from our churches.

# How Do I GIVE? CADENCE TITSWORTH

Good morning, my name is Cadence Titsworth. I go to Maryville High School. I've been a member of this church since January 18, 2009. So yesterday was my baptism birthday.

This week's prompt was, how do I give? Most of you probably started thinking about your money, and that's important too. However, how else can we give? We can give our money, our talents or our time. And although I don't have a job or a steady income of money, I can still give back to the church and God. Giving doesn't have to be a huge deal, it can just be small things to make people's day. For example, every Sunday, I hang out with the kids in the cry room so that the parents can listen to the sermon without worrying about their children. This gives me a chance to connect with the kids and the parents. I love playing with them and the kids are always so nice. I've made many good memories spending time with them, from building Legos to walking with them to communion and even dancing at the end of church. Saturday nights, I go to bed excited to see them the next day. Thank you to Micah, Isaiah, Charlotte, John, Victoria, and Felix.

I believe that church is about being with God's people and I try to always connect and help all the people I can. For example, every Monday that we don't have something planned, my family and I go to the food pantry to help. This helps me connect with the people at my church who I don't usually see and gives me the chance to talk to people who usually go to early service. All the volunteers at the pantry are always so sweet and I'm always excited to see all the people working that day. I'm thankful to God for giving me the opportunity to spend my Monday afternoons at the church with these people who are so loving and generous. However, it's not about the people at the pantry, it's the people that we help through the pantry.

In October, my whole family came together to build flood buckets to help people in North Carolina and East Tennessee, who had just gotten hit by the floods. We went to Lowe's together and spent a day picking out and organizing five-gallon buckets with 10 items in each to help people clean up. As devastating as these storms were, it gave families like mine the chance to connect with these

people but also realize how blessed we were. My family made memories making the buckets and then driving to North Carolina to give them to people.

The Bible says, each one of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion for God loves a cheerful giver. This verse is saying that you shouldn't just give because you're told to, but because this makes God happy.

It's easy to get in a rhythm such as mindlessly writing a check to the church and not thinking about how much you're truly giving. In Malachi 3, it says, will a mere mortal rob God and yet you rob me. You ask how are we robbing you and in tithes and offerings. This verse is saying that we aren't giving everything that God deserves to him. We are taking some bit by bit for ourselves instead of trusting God to take care of it. God doesn't need our money. He uses our money to reach others who do need it. Our money that we give to God goes to the church and the church uses these offerings to go to help other people in need. For example, our church works with the Salvation Army homeless shelters, deacons, etc. God is using us and our money to bring more people into heaven.
