

FIRST READING Jeremiah 31:31-34 pew Bible, page 721 Barbara Birkholz, Lector In a time of drought, the people pray for mercy, repenting of their sins and the sins of their ancestors. They appeal to God to remember the covenant, to show forth God's power, and to heal their land by sending life-giving rain.

<sup>7</sup>Although our iniquities testify against us, act, O Lord, for your name's sake; our apostasies indeed are many, and we have sinned against you. <sup>8</sup>O hope of Israel, its savior in time of trouble, why should you be like a stranger in the land, like a traveler turning aside for the night? <sup>9</sup>Why should you be like someone confused, like a mighty warrior who cannot give help? Yet you, O Lord, are in the midst of us, and we are called by your name; do not forsake us! <sup>10</sup>Thus says the Lord concerning this people: Truly they have loved to wander, they have not restrained their feet; therefore, the Lord does not accept them, now he will remember their iniquity and punish their sins. <sup>19</sup>Have you completely rejected Judah? Does your heart loathe Zion? Why have you struck us down so that there is no healing for us? We look for peace but find no good; for a time of healing, but there is terror instead. <sup>20</sup>We acknowledge our wickedness, O Lord, the iniquity of our ancestors, for we have sinned against you. <sup>21</sup>Do not spurn us, for your name's sake; do not dishonor your glorious throne; remember and do not break your covenant with us. <sup>22</sup>Can any idols of the nations bring rain? Or can the heavens give showers? Is it not you, O Lord our God? We set our hope on you, for it is you who do all this.

#### PSALM 46 pew Bible, page 506

Lector: God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

Congregation: Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea;

- L: though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult.
- C: There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High.
- L: God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be moved; God will help it when the morning dawns.
- C: The nations are in an uproar, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts.
- L: The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.
- C: Come, behold the works of the Lord; see what desolations he has brought on the earth;
- L: He makes wars cease to the end of the earth;
- C: he breaks the bow, and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire.
- L: "Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth."
- C: The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

#### SECOND READING: Romans 3:19-28 pew Bible, page 1028

Paul's words stand at the heart of the preaching of Martin Luther and other Reformation leaders. No human beings make themselves right with God through works of the law. We are brought into a right relationship with God through the divine activity centered in Christ's death. This act is a gift of grace that liberates us from sin and empowers our faith in Jesus Christ.

<sup>19</sup>Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. <sup>20</sup>For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

<sup>21</sup>But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, <sup>22</sup>the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, <sup>23</sup>since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; <sup>24</sup>they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, <sup>25</sup>whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; <sup>26</sup>it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

<sup>27</sup>Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. <sup>28</sup>For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

## A Mighty Fortress Is Our God



#### APOSTLES CREED Martin Luther's Small Catechism with Explanations

Pastor: Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us proclaim our faith.

Pastor: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

What does this mean?

#### Congregation:

I believe that God has created me together with all that exists. God has given me and still preserves my body and soul; eyes, ears, and all limbs and senses; reason and mental faculties.

In addition, God daily and abundantly provides shoes and clothing, food and drink, house and farm, spouse and children, friends, livestock and all property—along with all the necessities and nourishment for this body and life. God protects me against all danger and shields and preserves me from all evil. And all this is done out of pure, fatherly, and divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness of mine at all! For all this I owe it to God to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is most certainly true.

- P: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary; suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; He descended to the dead. On the third day He rose again; He ascended into heaven, He is seated at the right hand of the Father, and He will come to judge the living and the dead. What does this mean?
- C: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father in eternity, and also a true human being, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord. He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned human being. He has purchase and freed me from all sin, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death. He has done all this in order that I may belong to Him, and live under Him in His kingdom, and serve Him in eternal righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and rules eternally. This is most certainly true.
- P: I believe in the Holy Spirit; one holy catholic church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting.

  What does this mean?
- C: I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord, or come to Him; but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith, just as He calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one common, true faith. Daily in this Christian Church the Holy Spirit abundantly forgives all sins-mine and those of all believers. On the last day the Holy Spirit will raise me and all the dead and will give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life. This is most certainly true.








#### PREFACE FOR THE PENTECOST SEASON
